School ethos/mission statement

Oakwood Learning Centre is a unique Integrated Therapeutic Provision that provides a safe, caring and learning environment within which personal growth and development is promoted. We place learning at the centre of everything we do offering an individualised structured curriculum that is differentiated and relevant to the student needs.

Our recent Ofsted Inspection rated Oakwood Learning Centre as 'outstanding' in all areas' (July 23) which is a continuation of all Ofsted inspections meeting the Outstanding criteria since the schools opening in 2015.

Our Integrated Therapeutic Provision provides a highly personalised curriculum with structured learning programmes tailored to individual needs.

Within Oakwood Learning Centre we raise the standard of achievement for all, enabling students to develop into socially and emotionally responsible citizens by providing outstanding high quality education, care and therapy.

At Oakwood Learning Centre we endeavour to develop creative and responsible students who are able to deal with diverse situations and to direct their lives with purpose.

We therefore gradually, and through a carefully planned development, merge the creativity, with a highly structured approach to learning to create an innovative, exciting and creative outstanding learning environment.

Aims of Oakwood Learning Centre

Our collective aim within Oakwood Learning Centre is to equip all our students with the skills they need to access education where they will continue to develop and leave full time education as well rounded individuals who are resourceful, creative, responsible and curious with the skills necessary to meet the challenges of the 21st century and with the problem solving skills required for a sustainable future.

Oakwood Learning Centre is an 'Outstanding' provision (Ofsted July 2023) with positive feedback including:

- This is a school where pupils thrive. Pupils enjoy school. Pupils attend very well. Pupils' behaviour is positive. Pupils are safe. Bullying hardly ever happens. Staff listen to pupils. Pupils are confident that staff will sort out any problems they may have.
- Leaders are ambitious for pupils. Pupils study a wide range of subjects. Pupils get a lot of individual support. Many pupils have missed a lot of school before coming to Oakwood Learning Centre. Staff quickly establish a very thorough understanding of what each pupil knows and can do. Every pupil has a detailed individual support plan. Staff implement these plans extremely well. Pupils quickly become confident learners.
- Leaders have established a truly aspirational curriculum. Pupils follow the national curriculum. Pupils have the chance to take many qualifications. All teachers have strong subject knowledge. There are highly effective plans in place for all subjects. Learning plans are detailed and well sequenced. Staff revisit key learning regularly and with an increasing level of challenge. Staff constantly check pupils' understanding. Staff skilfully adapt lessons to meet the needs of pupils. Staff make sure pupils get the most out of every lesson
- The teaching of reading is strong. Many pupils who join the school are still at the early stage of reading. These pupils learn phonics. Trained staff deliver the school's phonics programme very well. Pupils quickly become independent readers. Leaders support pupils to read widely. All staff contribute to a love of reading. There are small libraries in every classroom. The books in these libraries are themed to match the subject being taught in that classroom.
- Pupils are proud of their school and behave well.
- The personal development of pupils is at the heart of everything the school does. Staff regularly remind pupils what it means to be a responsible citizen
- All teachers support pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development in their subject lessons.
- Teaching assistants work exceptionally well alongside teaching staff to manage pupils' behaviour, so that their learning is not disrupted.
- There is a well-planned personal, social and health education (PSHE) programme. In PSHE lessons, pupils learn about themselves and others. Pupils learn how to keep themselves safe and healthy. Pupils follow a relationships and sex education programme that meets statutory guidance.

- Pupils are very well prepared for further education, training or employment. All pupils learn about different jobs. Older pupils follow an accredited course in employability. Pupils receive up-to-date careers guidance from an independent careers adviser.
- The proprietor's vision is that pupils will achieve life-changing outcomes. All staff share this vision. Staff have a very thorough understanding of what each pupil needs to be able to learn well. Pupils are well supported by education psychologists and specialist therapists
- Pupils quickly find that they feel safe and are able to tackle situations they previously would have found daunting. For example, pupils have started college courses and willingly speak to visitors about their work.
- Leaders have established extremely strong lines of communication between home and school. Parents and carers speak very highly of the school. One parent said: 'This is a wonderful school. Before this school, our child was not getting any education. Now our child is flourishing
- Pupils enjoy coming to school and their attendance is very high.

Oakwood Learning Centre offers a broad and truly bespoke curriculum allowing pupils to pursue both academic and vocational pathways allowing individuals to strive in their areas of strength. Oakwood learning centre offers over 36 nationally accredited courses from individual unit awards, specialised outdoor activity accreditation through to GCSE and beyond. Oakwood learning centre has close links with local colleges and offers students further educational experiences and training where applicable.

Oakwood Integrated Provision is committed to the following principles:

- To provide the highest standards of care and education
- To ensure safety, security and opportunities for success for all

At Oakwood Learning Centre we believe in the concept of lifelong learning and the notion that learning should be a rewarding and enjoyable experience for everyone; it should be fun. Through our teaching we aim to equip children with the skills, knowledge and understanding necessary to be able to make informed choices about the important things in their lives. We believe that appropriate learning and teaching experiences help children to lead happy and rewarding lives.

The curriculum at Oakwood embraces all that is learned through school, whether in lessons or as part of informal learning within and beyond the school day. It includes not only the requirements of the National Curriculum but also the wide range of activities that the school

provides in order to enrich the experience and learning of the children. What the children learn from the way they are treated and expected to behave is also part of the curriculum. The school has a clear focus on the personal development and wellbeing of each child, as well as on their academic progress.

At Oakwood Learning Centre, we aim to teach our students how to grow into positive, responsible people who can work and co-operate with others while developing their knowledge and skills, so that they achieve their full potential. Students at Oakwood access a wide curriculum tailored to each student's specific areas of need.

At Oakwood Learning Centre we provide an education that provides students with opportunities to explore and develop their own moral values and beliefs, spiritual awareness, high standards of personal behaviour, a positive caring attitude towards other people, an understanding of their social and cultural traditions and an appreciation of the diversity and richness of other cultures. We understand the key role this plays in allowing students to achieve and develop both academically and socially. These key concepts will be promoted throughout the curriculum and in all aspects of school life.

Oakwood Learning Centre enjoys utilising the benefits of innovative curriculums including the use of Virtual Reality and LEGO Education within our curriculum. This is to enable students to be active, creative and collaborative and to solve a range of issues and problems they are presented with. We utilise these educational ideas as tool to develop students understanding of the modern world around them whilst providing the safety and continuity of the Oakwood site and staff team. Learning takes place with students actively constructing artefacts in the learning environment but simultaneously constructing knowledge in their minds. Constructing with others and vocalising their ideas collaboratively extends this learning even further, allowing students to focus on not only what they learnt but how they have learnt throughout the process. This in conjunction with our academic and vocational offer of education allows each learner to be fully immersed in their own educational journeys.

Oakwood Integrated Therapeutic Provision is a co-educational, specialist 52 week fully integrated, therapeutic, education and care facility situated on a 10 acre site near Darlington.

The provision meets the needs of young people aged 8-18 exhibiting a diverse range of social, emotional and behavioural difficulties, alongside other associated conditions

Applications are considered by our admissions panel and a non-prejudicial visit will then be arranged. Following this visit a place may be offered to pupils whose needs can be fully

addressed by the school. Fees and NASS approved contracts will then be agreed with local authorities.

Details for consideration of pupils/ parents whose first language is not English

On admission a child's need for additional support is identified. Appropriate provision is then established prior to the pupils start date. One to one support from a bi-lingual support assistant will be provided if this is an identified requirement.

Details of complaints procedure

In accordance with the Children's Act 1989, all students at Oakwood Learning Centre have access to a Complaints Procedure. Informal complaints or concerns will be initially addressed by the Centres Pastoral Manager. Formal complaints directly from the child or via a parent/carer or member of staff should be reported directly to the Head Teacher. If these complaints are in regards to the Head Teacher than the Regional Director should be contacted. The schools complaint and representations policy outlines details of how to make complaints and is available on our website or can be supplied via post if required.

Complaints or concerns arising from adults also follow set procedures as outlined in the school complaints policy. We have had zero complaints within the academic year 2022-2023, but any complaints would be taken extremely seriously.

Statement regarding accessing exam results

Exam results are accessed in accordance with to the Awarding Body Policies and Procedures. Dates are published annually by Awarding bodies and we are compliant with their processes. Examination results can be obtained by contacting the Learning Centre Head Teacher. All Key Stage 4 pupils sit externally accredited examinations in line with their educational plans. The school offers a range of accredited examinations through a range of examination boards.

Promoting General Welfare

Anti-Bullying

We pride ourselves on our warm and caring atmosphere. All members of our community are entitled to safety and protection and therefore bullying will not be tolerated. We have clear policies and guidelines raising awareness in staff, children and young people to signs of bullying. During the last 12 months there were no reported incidents of bullying in Oakwood Learning Centre. Students and staff take part in regular anti-bullying awareness events.

Health and Safety

At Oakwood Learning Centre the Health and Safety is coordinated by Lynne Nixon. The whole site has internal health and safety checks in place for the maintenance staff to complete, with an action plan put in place to rectify any faults. The Witherslack Group's Management and Risk Assessment Teams visits and audits the school each term.

First Aid/Medical Care

All staff as part of their induction training complete a one-day Basic First Aid course for children's services. All First Aid training is followed up with refresher training every three years.

The on-site Children's Homes administer prescribed medication to students, however a number of staff within the Learning Centre are also trained in the administration of medication should they be required to administer. All medication is recorded and kept in a locked medical cupboard.

Governance

Oakwood Learning Centre has a board of governors, chaired by Stephen Hall. Board meetings are held regularly, and notes stored for each meeting. The Head teacher provides accurate up to date information of the school's progress against its school development plan (SDP) and highlights the continued progress of all pupils in the school. The governors provide professional challenge and support the development and implementation of key strategies of improvement in the school.

Details regarding staffing and recruitment

Oakwood Learning Centre follows a rigorous recruitment process in order to recruit high quality staff and ensure that children and young people are kept safe. Senior Leaders involved in the recruitment process undertake safer recruitment training and all staff employed within the school are subject to an enhanced DBS check.

Within The Learning Centre we have a Head Teacher, Deputy Head Teacher, 5 full time Teachers, 7 full time Teaching Assistants and a Pastoral Manager.
