The little boy that joined the home craved attention and this was instantly recognised by staff who put in place boundaries and expectations of behaviours to allow Felix to settle into his new home. Unsurprisingly he did not have trusting relationships with adults and therefore it was important to invest time in this, to help him feel at ease and also develop much needed self-esteem and awareness. A full support plan was devised with emphasis on therapy and support around attachment issues and trauma, to help the young boy thrive at home and at school.



A break through moment for Felix? There have been plenty from making new friends and accessing a range of activities at the local youth zone to joining an arcade club where he engages with other young people with similar interests. The little boy that struggled to sleep has a good bed time routine demonstrating that that he feels more secure and settled at Beech Tree.
